Dear Mother

Have been away from my company since Oct 17th and of course have received no mail since, the last one I got was written on your birth day and it reached me Oct 15th when I got back to the Company suppose there will be quite a lot of mail there. Am feeling pretty well but haven't much "zip". Hope the handkerchiefs have been received by now.

We are having very mild weather for November. Seems as if the weather man was on the side of the Allies and as if he wanted to see the end of the war before Christmas too.

I think I look about the same as when I left home, only I am becoming quite bald and that I blame on the old tin hat. It has been very comforting at times when pieces of shell are flying about.

Hope you are well and will still write to the old C-Co 102 US Engrs, where I hope to be before long. I resigned and mailed the power of attorney to read a month ago and then

told me here that I would
get that allotment money some
-time. Have some money so
don't try to send me any!
